Opening Comments: We were saddened to learn of the passing of a long time member, Howard Johnson. Ben Newkirk's son had a major illness and Ben flew back to New York to help him out. He has made a huge turn around and is doing much better.

Safety Officer's Report:

The main gate to the field was found open Sunday morning, 12/4.

The AMA noise abatement recommendation is 96db @ 20 ft. over a soft field and 98 db over a hard surface. This equates to 102 db @ 10 ft. Our requirement for Cactus Park is 96 db @ 10 ft. We will use 96 db @ 10 ft. to keep peace with our neighbors.

There have been encampments in the river bed. Don Westergren said that Helix Water District has jurisdiction for that area. Ron Smith talked to the County Park people to make them aware of the situation. This issue makes it imperative to keep our gates closed when we are not at the field.

Tabled Business: In November, the club tabled Lee Main's motion to start the \$27 per month trash collection. The board reviewed our current financial situation, compared to last spring. They found that we are currently ahead \$1500 because of self-supporting events and stopping the use of the large dumpster. The new trash bill of \$27 per month was approved by the membership.

Old Business: The banquet will be held on Friday, January 6. Dinner tickets will be \$25 per member. \$45 per couple. \$25 for all guests.

The raffle will have prizes totaling \$1500. Ted O'Fallin will be acquiring the prizes from Discount Hobby Warehouse. Bob Muhleman volunteered to help pick up the prizes. Lee Main volunteered to help Ted at the banquet with ticket sales.

We must have a final head count for the banquet by Dec. 30^{th} .

TIPS & TRICKS

Get Clean!

If you forget to use a barrier cream or latex gloves to prevent your hands from getting sticky when using epoxy, don't use alcohol, acetone, or other solvents to clean them. Besides being harsh on your skin, those chemicals always leave a sticky residue no matter how many times you wipe your hands.

Instead use hand lotion to remove the epoxy residue. Just wash your hands with the lotion, rinse it off and the wash again with regular hand soap. It works like a charm and your hands will smell great!

Gloves for CA

If you're allergic to latex, one thing that works really well as an alternative—and is really inexpensive—is to use cheap plastic sandwich bags to cover your hands. They work well and are thin enough that you can feel that heat of the glue as it sets.

This works really well when you are applying glass cloth with CA, because you can hold the cloth to the balsa and feel when the glue sets. It lets you use very little CA to put down the cloth and saves quite a bit of weight.

Howard Winslow Johnson

June 3, 1924 – Nov 25, 2011

Dad was called home to his promised glorified life in Heaven after a very short illness. His passing leaves a large void in the lives of his family a n d h i s friends. Born in Flandreau, South Dakota he traveled with his mother on the train to San Diego, CA in 1926 to join his father who was stationed here with the Navy. He spent his entire childhood in San Diego, graduating from San Diego High School in June 1942. Within months of graduation, he enlisted in the Army and served as a glider mechanic in World War II. After his service he took advantage of the educational benefits offered by the military and studied engineering at San Diego State College. During Easter Vacation, in March 1946 he eloped to Yuma, AZ with Val Turner, a San Diego High School Graduate. Before completing his engineering degree he decided dentistry was really his calling and changed

majors. He attended USC, Northwestern School of Dentistry and eventually finished Orthodontics training at University of Missouri, Kansas City. His two kids were born while he was in school, but with his education and his family complete he returned to San Diego in 1960 and opened his private orthodontic practice in the San Carlos area and practiced there for 34 years, retiring in 1994. He considered orthodontics to be engineering on a smaller scale and is responsible for thousands of beautiful smiles in San Diego and Imperial counties.



He had multiple and varied interests that kept him busy until the very end. A lifelong Lutheran, the family joined St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in 1965. Retirement gave him the opportunity to rekindle his love of aviation that started in childhood and was enhanced during his service in WWII. He



began building and flying model airplanes and was active in the First Weed Whacker Aero Squadron. When he was not flying, he could



be seen driving his beloved pink 1955 Studebaker around town as well as in parades and car shows throughout San Diego. He was a member of the Studebaker Drivers club as well as the antique car club of the Al-Bahr Shrine. He and mom joined the El Cajon Elk's Lodge early in their retirement so they could continue their love of dancing and socializing. Dad was widowed in 2008 after 62 years of marriage, but the members of the Elks Lodge remained close friends until the end. Many friends listened to his stories of their adventures. He was especially proud during 2007 when he would announce he was the grandfather of "Two Queens and a President", referring to the year Emily was Miss Rodeo Ramona, Katy was Miss Bulls Only Rodeo and Sara was President of the El Capitan High

School FFA Chapter.

Dad will be remembered for his love for life. His character traits of honesty and loyalty will be his legacy and will live on in the ones who remain behind.

He is survived by his brother, Lewis E. Johnson (Helen); Daughter, Vicky (Gay) Morris (Dean); Son, Ed Johnson; granddaughters, Emily (Gay) Junk (Dan), Katelyn Gay, Saralynn Gay and his Great Grandson Jake Randall Junk.



Editor's Note: Howard was a personal friend to so many in the club. He was a true WWII veteran, getting into a bit of trouble when he went AWOL, flying Co-Pilot in a glider into Holland when he should have stayed in England. He led a simple life, no computers, no TV. He put his priority on family and friends. His RC modeling is typified in the photo of his Round-Tuit—look close and you see the round table has tea cups and saucers on it. This is just an example of his humor and love of life.
