

Safety Officer Report: Ron Keith

Fire Extinguishers, we have several one-time use extinguishers which are not refillable. Ron Smith will lock them in the shed so that can't be used. Ron is also checking the age etc of the refillable ones we have to make sure they are current.

Ron Smith - On the Safety theme, the 2 2-way radios & charger are missing. They must have been removed during a flying day when the Peg Cabinet is open! If you hear anything the board would like to know..

Gary Rold said we are unlikely to replace them as most people have cell phones these days if you need to do a model rescue make sure one of the party has a Cellphone & someone in the Pits does also. (Make sure you both have each other's number!)

Committee Reports

Keith Miller- Fun Fly this Saturday the events will be:

TWO MINUTE PRECISION TOUCH 'N' GO

Stop watch starts when plane leaves the ground. Pilot performs as many touch and go maneuvers as possible in two minutes. The plane must turn at least 180 degrees between each landing. Time continues if the engine quits during the attempts. Precision points are awarded for each touch and go within a specified target set of circles. Points are awarded by circles, 10, 8, 5 and 3 points. A touch and go outside of the circles receives 1 point.

FLIGHT DRILL

From an air start, when the <u>pilot</u> say's "GO" the clock starts and the pilot executes as many loops as possible in 30 seconds. After time expires, the pilot's allowed to regain composure. Then when the <u>pilot</u> says "GO", he must execute as many rolls as possible within 30 seconds. The sum of loops and rolls is the total score.

LIMBO LUNACY

Set limbo streamer at 6', 1 minute time limit. Time starts when pilot makes first successful pass below the streamer. One point per pass below the streamer. Cut the streamer or hit pole and time stops.

CLIMB 'N' GLIDE

Pilot is given 30 seconds after takeoff to climb high as possible. At 30 seconds, the engine is stopped and the clock is re-started. Internal combustion pilots have the option to simply go to idle, affording them the same safety factor to get out of trouble that the electric models have. Landing must be on runway. High time wins. Deduct 5 seconds if plane doesn't come to a stop on the paved runway, wheels down.

Additional 5, 10, 15 or 20 seconds added if the plane stops in the bomb-drop target zones.

Can Can

Tie an empty soda can to a length of string and tie the string to the tail wheel of the airplane. Fly the airplane in such a way as to touch the can down onto the circle target. Three tries are allowed. Points are awarded by circles, 10, 8, 5 and 3 points. A touch and go outside of the circles receives 1 point.

Micro Pylon Races (NEW!)

Classes (most commonly E-Flite or Park zone, but can be any):

Warbirds: 1S cells of 150 mAh capacity or less (1 heat, all-in) (P-51, P-40, Corsair, T-28 etc)

Open: 1S or 2S cells with 200 mAh capacity or less (1 heat, all-in) (includes the Beast, Sbach, Pitts, Yak 54, etc)

Pylons are set roughly 50 to 70 feet apart. The simple, clean option is an oval CCW pattern around the pylons with ground start.

The Carnage Challenge - Figure 8 race pattern. And to spice it up, do a loop around the limbo tape at show center during each pass.

Race Report

Lance Edmunson – The last one of the season is on the 25th of October at Weedwackers. Bobby Rink that well known Chef will be cooking up some good BBQ eats etc.

Response to video – Silent Flyers 2 events next year. Next year's event schedule needs to be worked on with hopefully the help of other clubs.

Builders Meeting

This needs to be driven by the membership, as Gary doesn't have time to chase this up all the time. So if anyone has an interest & wants to arrange a group meeting etc, have at it!

Tabled Business

Field rule #14 "Model should be pointed such that prop blast with engine running will be directed away from other models or people". (Propwash). Gary feels that this rule is redundant because we

now have the Start-up tables up front & it alleviates most of the issue. The board will look into revising or removing it later.

Runway Condition

Resurfacing issues – We will apply for an AMA Grant to assist in the cost, could take some time to obtain.

We have got several bids for various types of resurfacing etc:

Sealcoat – Asphalt Emulsion sealer, does not build up or fill cracks well. Bid estimate: \$3,500 NOT recommended

Slurry Coat – Mixture of asphalt, Portland cement, sand & water. Applied by a screed, from a truck, the cement adds to strength the sand fills in cracks & divots etc Bid Estimate including taxiway but not Pits: \$8,600 (.30/ft.) We MAY be able to cover this form our funds

Topping Coat Fabric & Oil based 1 1/2" Bid Estimate \$36,540

Petromat – Similar to roofing felt, original developed for parking site. Ron will do more research. Imperial Valley have a similar runway which Ron, Phil & I have flown off OK.

The surface is cracking quite badly & obviously will get worse as times go on. At the moment the Slurry Coat seems to be the best for the cost.

Ron discussed creative options to raise money that he has used in the past. Will be discussed later as/if we move forward.

He also addressed the Patching process which is labor extensive & can be expensive if a large area is covered. Our Runway is 375' long by about 75' wide.

More investigation will be diligently made..

A suggestion to angle the tables to reduce Prop-Wash issues was suggested, BUT it was pointed out that this may affect the safety of the tables in relation to Props flying off without hurting anyone.

Ron mentioned that the Test Table has been moved to the far end of the Pits by the Storage Van & should be used if you need to do some maintenance which requires the engine to be run-up.

Safety is STILL every body's responsibility! Offer assistance if you see it may be needed.

Fun-Fly Event Report, October 11th 2014

Our October Fun-Fly was a ton of fun! Thanks go out to the participants, and especially to those who volunteered their time in support. Jeff Coskey and Vernon Gilmore were our dedicated timers and kept each contestant briefed up on the sequence of events. Coffee, muffins and photography were courtesy of Bruce Allen. The micro races went off well with two Habu's, two Sbachs and a Pitts in the ≤200 mAh class. While Lary Kosta's and Tim Peterson's Habus have good speed, it seems they don't much like the hard

turns and... well - their pointy ends aren't quite so pointy anymore. Ryan Danielson took the race with his Sbach with Jeramy Miller and Lance Edmunson to follow.

In the 1S \leq 150 mAh class we had a Corsair and a P-51. OK, so they don't move real fast...

In the precision touch-and-goes (points totals for accurately hitting the landing bull's-eye circles within 2 minutes) went to Glen Merritt. This is his

specialty event, gaining 80 points!

During the Flight Drill, all eyes were on Frank Sanders as he amassed 82 loops and rolls inside of 60 seconds! His rolls were a real challenge to count. The next best effort was Ryan Crutchfield with 49.

Ryan Danielson suffered the first of his three crashes. In this event, his Apprentice's rudder came off and he ditched into the river bed. A little CA - good to go.

In the Climb-and-Glide (30 sec climb, power-off glide as long as you can), a couple of guys didn't make the runway (had to apply power to safely return), a DQ. Fred Miller put the pedal to the medal to build up some climbing speed on his take-off roll, but unfortunately his main gear folded prior to leaving the runway, putting him out for the rest of the day. Ryan Danielson (1:49.8) was set to beat Keith Miller (1:45.2), but Keith's landing came to a stop dead center in the landing zone earning a 20 second bonus to take the win.

In the Can-Can (towing a soda can and touching it in the bomb zone for points), Larry Kosta joined the fun showing us great technique with some hefty ballast in the can.

Ryan Danielson made some of his attempts inverted - crash number two. OK, fixed - then in another attempt he flew the can, not the plane and.... things got ugly... the tail of his plane

was held on only by the pushrods. More CA please? In the end, Ryan Crutchfield took the Can-Can with 14 points in 3 attempts followed closely by Ryan Danielson ("Mr. CA") and Lance Edmunson.

Finally the limbo brought all the excitement, shooting for as many passes under the ribbon as possible inside of two minutes. We had some good wind, proving that the intended use of crepe paper streamer would fail. switched to surveyors tape which really helped the excitement factor. Max Merritt caught the ribbon three times while never breaking it or crashing! Frank Sanders was working up a sweat flying his 18 ounce profile into the wind, only to have the wind blow the pylons over twice! Thanks to Rich Crutchfield for bravely

holding up one pylon while hiding behind it. Frank Keith found the gravel in a hard way, ripping his just caught the ribbon on his last pass, pulling him T-28 wing off. Then Ryan Danielson, after all of to the ground. Busted prop - that was it! Jeramy his repairs, just beat out Glen in the limbo and

Max held his plane in a constant speed, altitude and turn rate to continuously circle around the northern pylon and under the ribbon. Well done! His dad Glen put his model into a flat turn centered around the pylon as well (lots of rudder) and gave us a great show!
