
## **2015** Membership

#### Safety Officer Report: Ron Keith

Mentioned a possible incident at the entrance to our field a lady in a Van was doing a U turn when a person in a truck came speeding down narrowly missing her vehicle. We all know how dangerous the exit is especially when turning Left.

Ron Smith suggested that if you want to turn left out of the field it is probably safer to turn right & go up towards the crossroad (Ashwood St & Willow Rd) where by the County site you should be able to turn & go back down Ashwood. Alternately turn left on Willow Rd & drive down to the junction lights at the 67.

Some discussion ensued on what could be done to improve the visibility etc. The Secretary suggested the use of Parabolic Mirrors situated at either end of the bend so



drivers can see what's coming? Ron Smith said this had been tried several years ago & the Mirrors used for target practice by some idiots.

## **SAFETY NOTICE**

We had a potentially serious injury at the field this month when a modeler was adjusting control throws on his electric powered model.

Fortunately other modelers at the field provided first-aid. It was probably only a few stitches worth, so that's a good thing. Nothing that seemed really serious.

The model was powered, with prop installed and unrestrained on a work bench. At some point the motor went to full throttle and right into his hand. The lesson is that, when an electric powered model is powered up, it must be assumed that the motor could start without warning.

Best practices include restraining the model with bench pegs or remove the propeller. Additionally, we often see (at least on a daily basis when I'm at the field) modelers carrying an armed electric model to the flight line in such a manner that their arms or hands are directly in the prop arc. The classic case is holding the model by the very inboard area of the wing leading edge with the prop right up near the forearm. In many cases they've been heard to say "It's not armed. See? I have my hand on the throttle stick." That is absolutely no guarantee against a receiver glitch or being bumped by someone. Please take this into consideration and stay out of the prop arc! It's easy, and may save you from a trip to the E.R.
