

AMA Flying Site Development/Improvement Grant Application

A question came up about the above, see extract from the Application:

"The 2015 Flying Site Development/Improvement Grant application consists of seven pages. The maximum grant award is 10% of the total project cost up to \$4,000. Only receipts or quotes that are to be paid for by the club are eligible for the grant program. Other funding that the club may receive such as additional grants and/or individual monetary contributions do not qualify for reimbursement for this AMA Program.

The recipients of the annual awards will be announced approximately May 1, 2015. If a club is awarded a grant, the project is expected to be

completed within 12 months of receipt of the award. Project costs can only include amounts spent since the previous year's application cutoff date, or projected work for the current cycle. If an application includes amounts for work already completed, provide documentation to show that work was completed between the previous and current year's cutoff date. Clubs cannot request monies for expenditures incurred more than one cycle back.

The grant application must be signed by the club president and forwarded to the appropriate AMA district vice president.

Grant applications must be received by the district vice president on or before March 1, 2015. The district vice president will review the documents and, if approved, sign and forward the documents to **AMA** Headquarters, attention Erin Dobbs, RE: Flying Site Grants. Applications must be received at AMA Headquarters on or before March 15, 2015. Should the district vice president find a problem with the application, he/she will contact the applicant and work to get the issues resolved before the March 15"

Presidents Message May 2015

Hello fellow Weedwackers. It's that time of the month again for me to take a shot at some words of wisdom. (I can almost hear the laughter)

If you read the minutes for the last meeting or if you were one of those who actually attended, you will have noted that two out of three votes have amended or changed our field rules. The issue for the use of the "Red Tables" was tabled due to the fact that, as written, it tried to encompass too much territory and some members were adamantly opposed to making the use of the red starting tables, mandatory.

For now the tables will be used on a voluntary basis for starting aircraft. Starting glow or gas engines in the pits is still permitted but I would ask that if members are seated in close proximity to your table that you would advise these members when you are about to start your aircraft, just common courtesy.

When moving aircraft while the engine is running or powered up, I would ask that you LOOK before you proceed to move the aircraft, to insure the path to the pilots station is clear of any other members. Again, just common courtesy.

It is understood that flying model aircraft can be a dangerous hobby but the risk can be reduced if everyone is alert and cautious.

We are coming up on our Patriots/ Armed Forces Day scale fly in on 16 May and Art Flores is coordination the event. I would encourage all members with prior military service to support this event. It is shaping up to be an excellent event and one I hope continues for many years to come. Break out those war birds and come fly or just show off your aircraft.

Results of FunFly April 12, 2015

This month's Fun-Fly and BBQ was a lot of fun. While we didn't have as many participants as the last Fun-Fly, we had seven which was still fun. Our pilots were Ryan Danielson, Keith Miller, Tim Peterson, Joe Stutsman, Chris Madsen, Larry Kosta and Larry Kosta Jr.

To start, the **Micro Races** had only two pilots – Ryan and Keith, both flying identical blue Sbach aerobats. After the 2nd lap, Ryan got distracted for a split second by that "other" blue plane and.... Let's just say a race with only 1 plane in the air isn't really much of a race anymore. (And that's about the only way I could've beaten Ryan anyway....)

The **Jelly Bean Haul** went surprisingly well. After the first round, four pilots were able to retain all 10 "beans" (actually Skittles) in their cup after taking off, doing 1 loop, and landing. In the fly-off, Tim bested the rest by doing a loop <u>and</u> a barrel roll, retaining 5 of his 10 Skittles. Talk about some smooth flying and greased landings today!

Now some drama in the **Climb-and-Glide** (30 second motor run, glide dead-stick to land on the runway; longest time wins). Joe and Ryan set some basic times for foamy ARFs (2:01, 1:50) early on. Both Larry's did well too, but didn't quite make it back to the runway (Rule #3 – the plane must land on the runway without applying power). Then came the drama with Chris putting his Cub up many hundreds of feet, then dropping the flaps and pulling

up a chair to relax. Cruising in with a super time of 3 minutes 44 seconds, he ... uh ... didn't make the runway. Rule 3 applies... no score. Dang! Then Tim pulls up with his super-charged T-28 and puts it nearly out of site in 30 seconds. Tim also got relaxed in HIS chair for well over four minutes of glide time but, you guessed it; Rule 3 applies. Tim also didn't land on the runway. So with a score of 2:01, Joe took that event with FrankenTrojan.

The **Can-Can** has become a favorite lately. This time around, Keith took the win at 18 points, with Joe and Chris both close behind at 14.

The **Poker Hand** was a new event in which pilots draw 2 cards from a deck of 20 (all 10's through A's). The goal is to make the best poker hand possible, "drawing" their final 3 cards by executing touch-and-go's in the target rings which are marked with A, K, Q, J and 10. Larry Sr. was in the lead for a while with two pair (Q's over 10's). Chris and Joe both drew to 3 10's, but Ryan took the win with 3 Q's.
