

### **Safety Officer**

Ron Keith – First Aid demonstration (See later in the minutes).

Gary Rold – Orange Buckets needs more sand & the Buckets need replacing.

Keith – A member had his fingers badly hurt when trying to adjust the engine while reaching over the Propeller Arc. He also had another incident when his Throttle was reversed & it spun up & put a large gash in his shirt right up against his skin.

### Lessons to be Learned or Re-Learned!!

1. Always restrain the Plane on the table with the Restraint Pegs or if it is a large model & you have to start it on the Ground make sure that it is restrained to a flying station fence post.

2. Do NOT reach over a Propeller when the Engine is running, in the case of an Electric Model make sure the LiPo battery is disconnected when working near the Propeller.

3. With an Electric Powered aircraft or Chopper etc never switch the Transmitter/ Controller off before you disconnect the battery as it is possible that the ESC can power the motor up at full power without warning. Finally keep a watch out for others in case they put themselves in danger!!

As an aside, Keith mentioned that the cost of striping only cost \$271 while the estimates we received had been in the thousands! Many thanks to Gary Lamb & all that were involved in making an excellent job of it!

Also, Keith mentioned that the extra paper copies of the latest Hanger News will be put in the Pin/Peg box (large white cupboard whatever) so they are available for visitors etc. Secretary will take care of that.

## .President's Message Aug 2016

#### Mid-Summer Luncheon

This year's luncheon, held at the Souplantation in La Mesa, went well! It was a chance for families and friends to gather for a short meal and a bit of camaraderie.

Bruce Allen's wonderful wife Anne contributed some special gifts for the women's raffle. And for the first time that Ted can remember, he turned a profit on an event raffle!

The grand prizes this year were a HobbyZone Super Cub S and a RTF Horizon Hobbies P51 Mustang. In addition, many of the members donated some terrific prizes that winners could choose from. Donated prizes included (all "new" or in excellent condition): a Hot Wings toy plane (free flight), a Propel Speed Star RTF helicopter, a Sig "Rascal 'C"" kit, an Ace "Bingo 40" kit, an Ace "4-20" kit, a Gerber gut knife, a men's Beverly Hills Polo Club leather wallet, an Electrifly 10A ESC, a remote glow ignitor module, an Ace R/C trickle something-or-other, an OS SF-25 R/C engine, a Futaba single-axis gyro, an Easy-Built "Hurricane" kit, a Top Flite "F4U Corsair" kit, a battery condition checker, a pair of TP-Link Wi-Fi network range extenders, and a RTF Blade MCX2 helicopter.

While the profit margin wasn't huge (\$5 to \$10), in retrospect it was a relatively huge success! History has shown that we lose about half of what we invest for raffle prizes. With \$500 spent by the club, we effectively earned about \$250 by having such charitable donations! Thanks to all who participated!

#### **Eastern Flight Pattern**

On two occasions in July I received calls from the ranch. And on no less than five occasions I've had to reign in pilots who venture close to or past the wind sock. Several of our Field Marshals have also taken to the task of reminding folks to stay West. Fortunately, the calls I received were very cordial, and I appreciated that! The Field Marshalls who were on site at the time(s) made good with the ranch patrons by visiting with them and keeping our relationship in good standing (Thanks Jeff and Butch!). Sure, in some cases our pilots may have been "in bounds" with the onlookers perceiving a violation through parallax. However **if our pilots were observing the twintower guidelines, we wouldn't be getting the calls**.



Twin tower guidelines, you ask? What's that? At the west end of the pits is a large poster that describes the line of sight to the two high-tension transmission towers north-east of the field on the mountain tops. The photo's I include here may help as well. From any of our flight stations, if our model flight paths are kept to the west (left) of the two towers (by visual line-of-sight), we're guaranteed NOT to be above any portion of the ranch. Now, obviously we need to land our planes (picture with the yellow landing pattern), but during this time we're much closer to the field and generally won't pass the boundary marker.

We've also had (in the past few months) a few crashes in which the impact was beyond the eastern boundary. The lesson to learn is that we have to consider how far our models will continue along a path should we lose the control link.

Bottom line - let's improve our awareness and practices to avoid flight to the east.




#### **OPENING!**

Stay cool out there!! (It's 107 in Santee as I type this....) Keith




