

Safety Report

Ron Keith - How to tell if someone is having a Stroke or Heart Attack?

(Thanks to Ron for the information he gave, I asked Annie (she who must be obeyed!) who is a qualified Nurse Midwife (RN, CNM) if she could give us a guide that is simpler for us chaps to understand)

<u>Stroke:</u>

<u>FAST</u>.

<u>*F*</u> ace drooping, does one side of face droop or is it numb, ask them to smile is it uneven or lopsided

<u>Arm</u> weakness, Is one arm weak or numb. Ask them to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downwards

<u>Speech</u> difficulty. Is speech slurred. Are they unable to speak or are they hard to understand? Ask them to repeat a simple sentence "the sky is blue". Are they able to correctly repeat the words?

 \underline{T} ime; to call 911 If the answer is yes to any of the above, even if the symptoms seem to be going away. Tell the operator I think this is a stroke so help comes quickly. Time is important don't delay, also note the time the first symptoms appeared for the EMT's.

Don't wait seek help call 911

Heart Attack symptoms may be sudden and intense but most start slowly. Chest pressure, tightness and heaviness, extreme fatigue, fainting and lightheadedness Nausea Pain shoulders neck, jaw or arms, shortness of breath without chest pain Sweating.

Women's symptoms may be different. And include fatigue, nausea, pain in shoulders, neck, jaws or arms shortness of breath with or without chest pain.

We recently learned that Joe Stutzman was involved in a serious motorcycle accident a couple of weeks ago. Please read his wife's message below and consider helping her and Joe prepare their home for what will surely be a difficult recovery.

"I'm Jill Stutzman, Joe's wife and mother of our kids. On March 19, 2017, Joe was in a motorcycle accident caused by avoiding a car. Joe's thoracic 11 & 12 vertebrae shattered,



causing a spinal cord injury, which has left him paralyzed from the waist down. He had a 5 hour (3 hours to sew spinal cord) surgery on 3/21. The doctor used screws & bolts to put the vertebrae together, and installed a rod from T-7 down to L-2. Joe also has 3 broken ribs, had a collapsed lung which required a chest tube, a broken nose, badly bruised elbow and hips, and more. Our house must be retro-fitted for handicap accessibility. Joe will also need a wheel chair, and a handicap van. Please help my kids and I provide for their Dad, who has always provided for us. Your thoughts, prayers for strength and fortitude, and financial assistance mean so much to us. Thank you for helping Joe come home to a house that is ready for him and his new life."

Banners: In preparation for upcoming public presentation and demonstrations, the board proposed and the club approved some funds to create fresh new banners. The first priority was a banner suited for display on the float for the upcoming Lakeside Western Days Parade. Then in comes club member Larry Kosta Jr. (pictured on the left, along with dad Larry Sr.), VP and General Manager of Advance Reprographics. Field Day, closure on May 6th: A reminder, the field will be closed for flying on Saturday, May



6th. Keep an eye out for last minute emails requesting specific supplies or materials. For instance, we'll need a **source of water** for a pressure washer. If you have access to a portable tank or bladder with possibly up

200 gallons of

water, please step up. The weeds are quite tall and widespread. The more **weed-whackers** (literally) we have, the better! We're also in need of bleach/ water mixture and a hand garden sprayer (to wet down the inside



of the shed). Scrub brushes, buckets, , cans of gas, grill-cleaning supplies and more are needed.

If you're a handyman, at least two of our tables are suffering from **table-top delamination**. Tools, materials and craftsmanship are requested to address those.

Pilot's position during flight

The field rules state "Pilots must stand behind the fence in one of five flight stations for takeoff, flight and landings (5 planes maximum at any time)."



Firstly, let me emphasize "behind the fence". In the past month I've personally witnessed two instances where this is came into play. In one case, an errant landing brought a model into the shins of another pilot who was "at" the fence line. The model was coming in from the west which is the least protected of all. However had the pilot been "behind" the fence, there'd be no shin bruise.

On another occasion, an EDF was coming in for a landing and was overtaken by the wind. Another pilot, this time behind the fence, was protected.

Secondly, "behind the fence" doesn't mean "in the pits". The spirit of the rule is that you're occupying a flight station if you have a bird in the air. So as summer heats up and the thermals kick in, glider pilots may feel enticed to sit in a chair back in the shade of the pits while enjoying lift for a long flight. This isn't in the spirit of the rules. Reason being that we're limited to five aircraft in the air at once. Without a pilot per plane in the flight stations, there's a possibility that a sixth pilot, seeing a flight station "open", could put a sixth plane in the air. A major problem? No. But a rule nonetheless. If an Event Manager or Contest Director needs to put more than five planes in the air at once, that's up to him since there's a more dedicated focus on traffic during such an event. But during our regular flying - 5 planes, 5 pilots, at the flight stations.


