
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Toys for Tots

Safety Report

Ron Keith – If a plane goes down take an Extinguisher & a stick, let someone know that you are going out on a recovery & have a Cell phone or the Walkie Talkies (if charged!). Watch out for snakes!

Ron has reorganized our First Aid Kit to make it easier to use. Gloves, antiseptic wipe, betadine etc

Note: if you are going to work on someone who has a wound then put on a pair of gloves out of the kit for your own protection! Use 'Mr. Sock' to provide compression on top of the wound.

Ron will be presenting a refresher Sock wound treatment at the November Meeting.

Bob Muhleman- Had an incident where the engine started backwards & caused him an injury. The Plane was restrained for going forwards but not back off the table(?) Bob suggested that he could make some form of restraint, & be reimbursed for the cost?

There was some discussion & Keith said he would follow up with Bob.

I mentioned that wheel restraints are normally called "Chocks", & hilarity ensued, fine below is the definition:

"Wheel **chocks** (or **chocks**) are wedges of sturdy material placed closely against a vehicle's wheels to prevent accidental movement. **Chocks** are placed for safety in addition to setting the brakes. The bottom surface is sometimes coated in rubber to enhance grip with the ground."

Nominations for Club Officers - In keeping with tradition, November is election time! The four elected posts within the club are President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer (all other positions are by appointment). Rule Proposal - R/C Cars - At the September meeting, I proposed an addition to the Field Rules to recognize the use of R/C Cars. Due to the limited attendance at the meeting, the motion was tabled to allow the club one more month to review the proposal and comment. So if you're interested, please come to the upcoming meeting at which time we'll pull it from the table and lay it on the floor one more time. The intent of the motion isn't to make our rules more complicated, but rather to provide Field Marshals and club Officers a documented policy should the need arise.

From last month:

Recently we recognized that we quidelines with rehave no spect to R/C cars. Sure, we're а model airplane club. But. many of our members enjoy cars as well, and we have a couple of areas in which cars can be safely driven. The upper south lot is good for buggies and trucks, while the is runwav

great for street cars with low clearance. I was going to bring up a rule about boats too, but I ran out of time.

I propose the following be added to the Field Rules:

"Radio control cars (and trucks) are permitted at the field under the following conditions:

Cars may be operated in the upper south parking lot (south of the berm) but must remain at least 20 feet clear of parked vehicles when operating (to preclude collisions or rocks from hitting cars).

Cars may be operated on the runway when no aircraft are flying or on the runway. Cars must leave the runway when a pilot is ready to taxi out.

At no time will radio control cars be driven in the pit area (between the pilot stations and the parking berm)."

One member moved to amend the motion as follows:

Change the 20 foot distance to 30 feet.

Include a statement that, should vehicles enter the southern parking area that R/C car operations must stop while the car is parking/ moving.

A Field Marshal must be present and control all runway operations of R/C cars (paraphrased).

Amendments #1 and #2 were accepted by the members in attendance. Amendment #3 wasn't, primarily because club members who might wish to use the runway when it's windy and flying conditions are poor, need not have a Field Marshal present to use the runway. Members also agreed that management of runway time between cars and aircraft is actually very simple and not need dedicated management of a Field Marshal.




The motion, as amended, will be presented once again and voted on at the next (October) meeting.

Red Flag Warnings – The month of October often brings Santa Ana winds and dry, hightemperature days. When this occurs, the National Weather Service issues a Red Flag Warning. Our agreement with the County is that we close the field to flying on those days. If you hear news reports of a Red Flag Warning, please keep an eye out for an email from one of the board members closing the field. We'll also do our best to post signs at the gate, but we may miss it once in a while. Please don't fly if you know there's a warning. There are some instances in which the media will announce a Red Flag Warning, but it may be for Orange County, desert regions or other nearby regions directly impacting us. In that case, I'll do my best to put the word out if we're NOT impacted.

To double check, please go to <u>http://</u><u>www.wrh.noaa.gov/map/</u> and look for yourself. As shown in the example, (as of the date of this writing) there's a Red Flag Warning easts of the Sierra Nevada mountain range. If you see that pink/red indication over Lakeside, we're CLOSED.
