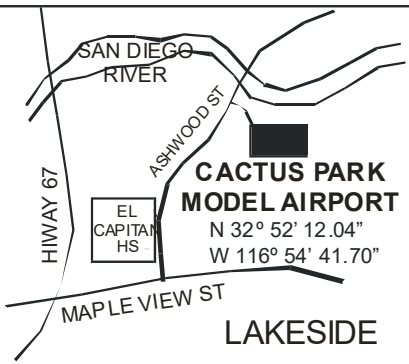
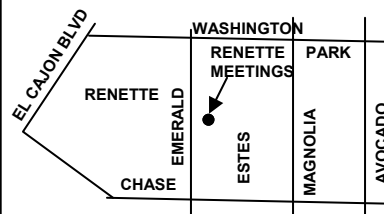
We were advised of his passing, however we do not have any information about services nor any details of his life. Phillip was a member of the club since January 1988.

Rules Review (field rules, bylaws, AMA Safety Code or AMA Safety Handbook)

Propeller Safety (AMA Safety Handbook)

- Painting tips of propellers a bright color helps you to better see the propeller arc during rotation.
- Check the propeller and spinner for tightness before each operation.
- Learn about and check for the proper grain patterns in wooden propellers to ensure strength in high rpm operation.
- Exercise extreme caution adjusting needle valve settings on engines. Most adjustments should be performed from behind the model, thus avoiding reaching around a spinning propeller.

We've located a local distributor of a product called TruSeal, specifically formulated to fill down into small cracks. As soon as I can get my tail end in motion, we'll buy a few gallons and get to fillin'.

Don Madison 9/1/1925—2/24/2018



Donald Kent Madison was born September 17, 1925 in Emporia, Kansas. At age 6 his family moved to San Diego, settling permanently in North Park where he remained a life-long resident.

After graduating from high school in 1943, he joined the US Army Air Corps and was assigned as Navigation School Instructor on B-24 Liberators during World War II. He married Beatrice "Babe" Valero, in 1948, graduated from San Diego State University with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering in 1949, and was called to Korea in 1950, serving 2-1/2 years as Navigator in B-29s with the Strategic Air Command. He retired in 1975 after 26 years of active and reserve duty.

His 40-year career in fleet management began in 1953 with SDG&E and ended in 1996 when he retired as Deputy Director of General Services, Fleet Operations Division after 14 years with the County of San Diego. He also worked evenings at Mesa College, teaching Business Organization & Management classes for 15 years, and was active in many associations, societies and clubs.

He enjoyed playing Tennis, hunting, fishing, and water-skiing, but his greatest pleasure was model airplanes. He built his first balsa wood plane at age 10, and enjoyed 80 years of building and flying radio controlled models of WWII aircraft. In 1988 he and close

friend Dennis Caudle co-founded the San Diego Association of Model Clubs, which became the blueprint for the largest association of model enthusiasts in the world.

In 1994, the widow of a fellow modeler called him for assistance in disposing of her husband's model inventory. He and good friend Frank Gagliardi sold the inventory and returned the proceeds to the widow. That developed into a long-time goal of giving back to the modeling community. Eventually, his name and offer of assistance for deceased modelers spread around San Diego, and when he had to stop for health reasons in 2015, he had helped 79 widows.

He loved God, his family, his friends, and his country. He did everything with gentleness and kindness. He spread love everywhere he went. He believed that a moment of kindness could make a difference in someone's life, and that a life spent being in service to others was a life well-lived. He loved us all, and still does.
