

Safety Report

Ron Keith- The Secretary had passed on to Ron some information on the possibility of loose 9V batteries as a potential fire hazard, Ron talked about this at the meeting.

I have since investigated this further, (Snopes) & found that this hazard is only partly true. Its not a good idea to store these batteries with the terminals bare but the likely hood of a fire is minimal.

Below is a link to a way to start a Camp Fire with Wire Wool, 9v Battery & a Tissue

"National Fire Prevention Association (NFPA) - advises specific handling and disposal protocols be adhered to when storing or discarding 9-volt batteries in order to minimize the possibility of their igniting and causing fires in rare conditions when they are stored with other batteries or objects composed of metal."

Keep them in the package they come in until you need to use them, typically for Smoke Detectors. When disposing of used ones put a piece of tape across the + & - terminals.

Correction: Ron mentioned that it was Fred Miller Jr's idea about the Fire extinguishers being situated in the flying area & according to Jeff Coskey people have been bringing them out when flying & <u>putting them back</u> in the Pin cupboard after the close of play.

Philip J. Pierce Trust

Back in April we'd learned of the passing of Philip Pierce of La Mesa, a long-time Weedwacker and member of several other local clubs. Unfortunately we weren't able to contact his family to offer service attendance (no active phone number). However we were

recently notified by registered mail that Philip named the Weedwackers as a specific gift beneficiary of his Trust (specific to model airplanes and associated tools and equipment).

I've contacted the associated agency and arranged a visit with his partner Mary Allen. Mary afforded me the opportunity to inspect the benefits. Suffice it to

say that the club benefit includes 20+ models, a wide variety of tools and supplies along with a couple kits and transmitters. Philip worked and stored his models in a beautiful hobby shop in his home, and the models are all very clean and in very good condition! There's a wide variety including very large scale (8' P51, 8' PT-17), several classic pattern ships, a few scale racers, several WW1 and WW2 scale models, a couple large 3D planes and a few smaller electrics.

The Trust is currently in a waiting period (permitting contest). The collection becomes available to us around July 20th. I'll arrange a working party to collect, stow, clean and catalog the material.

The current plan is to hold one or a small series of sales or silent auctions with the proceeds going directly to the club!

Runway Seal Coat

At the May meeting we approved funding the application of a seal coat to the runway. As you may have noticed, several of our members have been breaking their backs to fill the cracks as a matter of general maintenance and to prepare for the coat. We'll be coating not only the runway but the pit area as well. Butch is working with the contractor on a date. We'll likely close the field the day prior and the day of the work so that we can move the benches, clear the pits and blow out as much of the dirt as possible before the slurry is applied.

The coating will likely run about \$5500, and the subsequent striping paint another \$250 or so. Over the course of the next few months, you'll likely hear me petition for a small round of monetary contributions. This won't be nearly as extensive as the fundraising we did to re-pave the runway, and we won't be offering 3-year memberships. But depending on our





financial outlook come July/August, we may find that we need a few hundred dollars to cover our regular costs through the remainder of the year. One option that I'll pitch now is an **increase in dues**.

Dues Discussion:

Let me set the scene. Our current dues are \$60/year - that's \$5 per month. That covers, for the most part, trash services, port-a-potty, newsletter postage, web site hosting fees, field maintenance and support, first aid supplies and more. Our dues also cover the few raffles that we hold (annual banquet and the scale event), which usually see about a 50% loss. We also subsidize a portion of the annual banquet food price which is about \$1100. Some will argue that we should simply abolish the banquet (or at least the subsidy) and put those funds into the field. I contend that celebratory gatherings are a key aspect of building comradery within an organization.

Our budget has been fairly well balanced over the past decade. But prices are creeping up and we've historically done a poor job of proper runway maintenance (until our big investment two years ago).

If we can increase our annual income by just a couple thousand dollars each year, would could easily cover the sealing of the runway on a regular basis and better stay ahead of the game.

As an example, by raising dues from \$5/mo to \$6.25/mo, our 100 members (which exclude Juniors and Life members) would provide an increase in funds by \$1500/year. Over a 2-year period, that nearly covers cost of seal-coat for the runway (not the pits). That works out to \$75/year for each of us. Now, If we talk about \$7.50/mo (\$90/yr), that would give the club an additional \$3000/ year. That may be more cushion than we need, but by comparison, that's only \$2.50 more per month than we're paying now. That's a burger... a *cheap* burger.

There's a risk that <u>any</u> dues increase would likely drive away a small portion of our members; those who may only use the field occasionally or who are members for the sole purpose of comradery. The Board fully recognizes this, so our decisions need to be well informed.

So my question to each of you, would you accept an increase in dues to support the betterment of the club? And if so, how much would you tolerate? We don't have a good polling method to reach the entire club, so please bring your thoughts to the meeting, post on our Facebook page, send us an email, call us, etc.

A comparison of local club annual dues:

SEFSD (Mission Bay) \$50, 300+ members, no paved field, electric only

MRCF (Miramar) \$60, nice paved runway; restricted to military members with special procedures for civilian access

CVMRCC (Chula Vista) \$60, (complicated dues schedule); paved runway; located at the border.

Palomar RC flyers \$200, nice paved runway; located at the I-15 and the 76

Chollas Park RC Flyers \$80, paved runway just north of I-94 near College Grove

Please give this some thought and provide your thoughts.
