

#### **Meeting Minutes Apr 2019**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm with the Pledge of Allegiance. Officers present included the President, Vice President and Treasurer. The Secretary was called away on business. A total of 18 members were present.

The Minutes of the last meeting were approved (moved by Ron Keith, seconded by Ken Lawrence).

The Treasurer's report is as follows:

#### Safety Officer's report (Ron Keith)

LiPo batteries in transmitters; treat them like the batteries we charge for planes. Use fire-retardant containers or surfaces.

Even when charging NiMH or NiCd Tx batteries, chargers may not be smart enough and may lead to overheating.

Snakes are out in abundance - watch all areas. A hawk was seen carrying a snake around!

Mr. Sock was used on one member who's electric motor got away from him.

If you have any bad batteries that you'd like to get rid of, contact our Safety Officer. He can collect them and use them during our fire training sessions.

#### **Old Business:**
