

FAA Changes UAS marking Rule: https://www.faa.gov/news/updates/?newsId=93045

Extract: "(FAA) has posted a rule in the Federal Register requiring small drone owners to display the FAA-issued registration number on an outside surface of the aircraft. Owners and operators may no longer place or write registration numbers in an interior compartment. The rule is effective on February 25. The markings must be in place for any flight after that date".

Rules Review (field rules, bylaws, AMA Safety Code or AMA Safety Handbook)




President's Message Dec 2019






The Northrop P-61 Black Widow, named for the North American spider, was the first operational U.S. warplane designed as a night fighter, and the first aircraft designed to use radar. The P-61 had a crew of three: pilot, gunner, and radar operator. It was armed with four 20 mm (.79 in) Hispano M2 forward-firing cannon mounted in the lower fuselage, and four .50 in (12.7 mm) M2 Browning machine guns mounted in a remote-controlled dorsal gun turret.

It was an all-metal, twin-engine, <u>twin-boom</u> design developed during <u>World War II</u>. [4] Alt-

hough not produced in the large numbers of its contemporaries, the Black Widow was effectively operated as a <u>night-fighter</u> by <u>United States Army Air Forces</u> squadrons in the <u>European Theater</u>, <u>Pacific Theater</u>, <u>China Burma India Theater</u>, and <u>Mediterranean Theater</u> during World War II. After the war, the P-61—redesignated the F-61—served in the United States Air Force as a long-range, all-weather, day/night interceptor for <u>Air Defense Command</u> until 1948, and <u>Fifth Air Force</u> until 1950.
