

Burnelli CB-16

The Burnelli CB-16, also known as the Uppercu-Burnelli CB-300, was a passenger aircraft designed by the American company Burnelli in 1928. It was the first twin-engined aircraft to have retractable landing gear^[2] and the first to maintain altitude on only one out of two engines. Only one was built.


