The service is planned for 10:30am August 28, 2021. He will laid to rest alongside his wife Barbara at the columbarium at the church following the service.



Ron Keith- Reminded the membership that you must NOT charge LiPo batteries or any other types in your car! This a RULE & a requirement of the County. Charge them at home or at the field using our solar charging system. Also, whilst charging, the Batterie(s) must be in a fireproof bag or container!

Reminder if you must call for help with a

crash & Fire, make sure the Fire services understand it is for an R/C Model Plane NOT a full-size Plane! (Saves embarrassment....)

The Crash kit in the locker is to be used for a crash, not for anything else! At the end of flying, it should be locked up in the locker before leaving the field.

Reminder- loudly Call all Take-off's & Landings! Also, if you must cross the Runway shout out & make sure it is clear.

Last reminder, if you lose a Plane in the woods or anywhere that involves a search, make sure you have communication back at Pits in case you need help! (Cell phones etc)

President's Message July 2021

Wings Over Gillespie Flashbacks – Recently I posted a Facebook memory of my son Jeramy walking our 30% YAK out to the flightline of Gillespie field from back in 2012. For many years, both MRCF and the Weedwackers participated in either the Miramar or Gillespie air shows during either an early-morning or a midshow demonstration of our models. Wings Over Gillespie cancelled their events beginning in 2016.



One of our long-time members Lance Edmunson saw the memory and sent me a link to a video he'd created during the 2015 Gillespie air show, which by that time was "Air Show San Diego". That awesome video can be viewed at https://vimeo.com/airvidssc/

Then, very oddly and unexpectedly, there I am flipping through Instagram 'cause I'm just that kind of social butterfly (nope) and I come across a picture of my huge Sig Senior Kadet towing up my Carl Goldberg Gentle Lady on my piggy-back cradle! Tim Peterson recalled (because it's his hexacopter in the foreground) that it could have been a photo taken by someone at the Gillespie



Air Show maybe between 2012 and 2015 during which my son Jeramy, my father and I would all three fly during the demonstrations.

Then, no kidding, two days later the same per-

son posts another picture on Instagram of the Kadet/Gentle Lady pair, most likely from the same flight.

I miss those shows!

<u>Polo Field Incursions</u> – I've had reports that our weekday flyers continue to push out to the east beyond our boundaries. This comes from both the owners of the ranch and club member reports.

There's no reason for normal flight to be anywhere but in front of you or to the west (your LEFT).

We've modified the field boundaries to allow flight over the hill, providing us with more room to stretch out our flight path. USE IT please! If you're not able to land with an approach over the pump house, then don't fly. Secondly, if you're losing control, have a problem, or simply get behind the airplane, don't try to white-knuckle it for the awesome save if it's anywhere to your RIGHT. For the sake of the club's longevity, put it down! We recently had a model crash squarely between two horses in a corral while the pilot was going for the save. Let's not put the entire club at risk; ditch the plane early! Fortunately, the pilot, our VP and I were all on scene and met with the ranch owners for some much-needed apologies.

We can go back to a boundary monitor if that's what it takes; posting a watch at the windsock with a horn or whistle. We did it for a while – we can do it again. I hope it doesn't come to that.

FAA Drone Zone changes, future of exams! I think each of you get the routine AMA blog notifications by email. The two that recently caught my eye are 1) changes to the FAA Drone Zone (faadronezone.faa.gov) application process and 2) the AMA being approved to administer the dreaded "The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST)" exams.

On the first matter, the FAA registration under "the exception for recreational flyers" was made more complicated, driven by longer-term FAA requirements and attempts to grapple with all things sUAS. Fortunately, most of us (actually, it should be *all of us*) are

already registered and it won't matter much until we have to renew. The <u>AMA blog</u> does a pretty good job of walking us through the new options and questions that the FAA asks. For example, we'll need to tell them at least one of our models by manufacture and name, but we <u>don't</u> need to provide a serial number and we simply check "no" that our model doesn't have remote ID.

On the second matter of the TRUST exam (I guess that's redundant..., like "ATM machine"), the AMA assures us that it's easy, and that we can't fail. From a little bit of reading on the AMA blog, it's easy, it's mandatory (no exception), but there's no due date and there's no implication or impact on our AMA membership if we don't take it. I really don't know how something that's mandatory can go without any implications. So there you have it; take it or not – apparently nobody cares (yet).

Pylon Racing – I'm polling you all for interest in pylon racing! We had races for a few years that were a blast until the interest waned down to the scant same four guys at every event. I think we'll have enough renewed interest to run maybe a half-dozen races again in 2021/2022.

Jeff and I are posing three classes: 1) FMS T-28 (800 mm span) 2), Durafly Goblin (820 mm span), and 3) Micro (anything powered by a 1S 165 mAh



pack or smaller). The Silent Electric Flyers of San Diego (SEFSD, aka Mission Bay) have had

great success and fun with the T-28 class. The Goblin is a hand-launch little screamer that will surely





boost our adrenalin. The T-28 runs \$140, and the Goblin is \$100, both plug and play (you supply the receiver and batteries). In the past, we've had great success with the Durafly EFX Racer which is still available on the market, but is a bit pricier at 150.

The Micro class would be simply a fun competi-

tion for all of those who already have a small RTF (or kit, for that matter) that uses a 1S 165mAh pack or smaller). Obviously, the course for this class would be quite short, but it would be fun to get all those little planes-in -a-box together around the pylons.
