



Field Rules

Smoking: Rule 20 was there to prevent fire from Proposed: Ken Lawrence, Second: Ron Keith smoking, cigarettes, cigars & open flame. It did not cover Vaping, there is a new County Ordinance SEC. 41.118.5. SMOKING which prohibits all types of smoking including Vaping. We need to add to our Rules:

> Proposed Keith Miller, Seconded Bruce Allen, Unanimous.

> must measure less than or equal to 96 dBA at 3 meters (10 feet) taken as the highest of measurements measured from the front, rear and on each side of the model."

The AMA revised their guidelines several years ago (i.e., more than 10 years ago!) to 96 dB at **20 feet** over Website. soft field, and 98 dB at 20 feet over hard pavement. (AMA Doc 927).

We'll move this for a rule revision as well, recognizing BBQ planning - burgers Hot Dogs, Potato that the weighted average noise level at the property line remains unchanged at 50 dBA over a one-hour average within 100 feet of the property line.

> Don Westergren - Talked about the original sound measurements that were done to comply with the existing measurements & we have had minimal complaints & he is concerned we may raise an unnecessary control.

> Keith will carry out a Sound study to see what the



current levels can be. As he says its not an easy task when the sound of a car can upset the readings....

<u>Rules Review – Vaping vs Smoking</u> – The proposed revision passed at the February meeting which simply clarifies that vaping, in addition to smoking, is prohibited at County Parks. Posted and published copies are forthcoming.

Other "Rules" topics: Noise – The proposal to increase the noise limit from 96 to 98 dBA was withdrawn at the Feb meeting after some terrific discussions. Concurrence was reached that 1) if it's not broke, don't fix it and 2) increasing the limit would likely encourage those who know they have loud models to fly them rather than take steps to quiet them. Case closed.

Pin Box Lost and Found, "Free" table: Often, members may forget to pack everything up before going home, or we may find stray parts out in the field (canopies, bits of scale ordinance, wheels, etc). It's common practice and courtesy that those items be left in the safety cabinet for the rightful owner to collect next time they're out. Note that I say "rightful owner". The safety cabinent isn't used for free-grabs – it's our best solution for secur e Lost and Found cabinet. That said, Ron Keith maintains the cabinet and if he sees spare parts in there for more than a couple of weeks, they'll be removed. So grab your items if you see them there. Your items!





Secondly, the table directly across from the safety cabinet and under the bulletin board is often used for giveaways. If you leave something on that table, consider it free game. But please don't move those items into the safety cabinet; just leave 'em out. Eventually they'll go away.
