Secretary: Keith Miller


Safety Officer: Ron Keith (incumbent) As of this writing, there are no opponents.

### **Meeting Minutes Oct. 2022** #

#

<u>Call to Order</u>: The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am at the field. Club officers present were the President, Vice President and Treasurer. The Secretary was otherwise detained. A total of twenty members were present.

The meeting was kicked off with the Pledge of Allegiance was recited to new US and POW/MII flags hoisted at the field.

Also noted was that a generous member provided a new flag of the United States Marine Corps which will be flown when the US flag is taken down. After the meeting, Butch Weiser and Jeff Coskey discussed lighting of the US flag so that it can stay raised at all times. Butch generously donated a solar-powered light which will be purchased (Jeff) and installed in coming weeks!

The remainder of this year's meetings will be held at the field. The date of the November meeting is TBD. Keith considered holding it the morning of the Veteran's Day Fly-In, but that day will be busy. The prior Saturday is the swap meet. The meeting date is pending.

Scott reported that the treasury balance is about \$2000 shy of this time last year. There was discussion that we've not had the boon of donations to the club as we'd had in past years and the funds are slowly dwindling.

On the matter of monthly expenses, the monthly cost of the outhouse to United Site Services is currently upwards of \$411. At the September meeting, the Board took action to reduce that cost. Scott's investigation found several alternate suppliers, however with each, we'd either lose wheelchair access and/or the sink with only marginal (if any) savings). United Site Services can provide bi-weekly service for \$242.95 which is a fair savings. A survey of members indicates that we can easily go two weeks between services. Scott took action to make that change. Members were asked to monitor the condition of the outhouse over the next several months.

<u>Safety Officer Report</u>: Ron's recent inspection of safety equipment revealed two of the extinguishers to be dead. It's unclear if they were expended or simply lost pressure. He asked the membership, and there's been no reports of use of the extinguishers, so likely they just died. Ron will replace them.

#### **Upcoming events:**

Swap Meet and Toys-4-Tots Drive, Saturday Nov. 5<sup>th</sup>

Helpers are asked to meet at the field between 6:00 and 6:15 am to guide traffic and parking. Ron will collect entry fees. Richard Brown will monitor buyers at the berm. Frank Gagliardi and Lester Moore have collaborated to collect donations and cash. Frank reminded the members that toys for young teen girls make for a good donation as they're often forgotten. Those who may not feel comfortable choosing gifts are welcome to donate cash. Lester will turn that cash into treasures.

Veteran's Day Fly-In, Saturday Nov. 12th

Bobby Rink volunteered (prior to the meeting) to cook. Keith said that he'll ask Bobby to repeat the carne asada feast from last year. We'll also invite pot-luck dishes to supplement. Attendees will be asked to donate \$5 to offset the club's cost for the club-provided portion of the meal. Those who bring a pot-luck dish eat for free. Funding for the raffle prizes was moved by Keith Miller at \$500. After the motion and discussion that \$500 isn't enough, the motion was revised



to \$650 by Ron Keith, seconded by Steve Shepersky and approved. Ron will purchase the prizes and run the raffle. To supplement the raffle, Julian Sonderegger recommended that we ask members to bring donations of prize-worthy items. The membership agreed and Keith will put the word out.

Awards will be presented for Best Sport/Civilian, Best Military, Judges' Choice and Best Flight. Keith moved for expenditure of \$100 to cover the cost of four trophies at \$25 each, seconded by David Roche, approved.

#### Annual Awards Banquet, 06 Jan 2023

Keith reported that he's made initial contact with the Elks' Lodge in El Cajon, the venue we first tried last year with great success. We're waiting on confirmation from their Exalted Ruler. Further planning and budget allocation will be discussed at future meetings.

#### **Old Business:**

<u>Storage unit roof</u> is still on hold pending cooler weather... which is here. The Board will touch base with Mark Lukens as POC. The storage unit charging system is also in the works.

West-end charging system is still pending final connection by Kurt Meade. He's a hard-working guy.

Race Flags were finished by Jeff (and subsequently used after the meeting in our pylon racing event).

<u>Runway cracks</u> are on hold for now. The hot-fill tools and material that Jeff had selected may be a cost we'll defer for a short while. In the meantime, the cracks don't appear to be getting worse.

<u>Rules Review</u>: Keith reminded the membership of the AMA Safety Code that requires we avoid flying directly over unprotected people and moving vehicles. This comes into play anytime cars are on the dirt road or when members are walking about north of the runway. The code will also apply in coming months as San Diego County Parks continues to remove overgrowth of tamarisk (saltcedar, "tamarix") from the riverbed. The County work will continue though February. Members are reminded to adjust flight patterns to ensure that there's no chance of incursions on loss of control.

#### **New Business:**

Remote ID and FRIA: Keith reminded the club that the Board will establish club status as a FAA-recognized identification area (FRIA) as soon as the FAA AC is issued. There was some discussion that, while there's no direct impact on the club or our flying, there will be impact on manufacturers of ready-to-fly (RTF) models since suppliers will have to comply with the FAA's remote-ID hardware requirements.

Estate Auction, Frank Gagliardi for Mike O'Donnell: Frank briefed the club on an extensive collection of scale kits and models that he'll be auctioning on October 15<sup>th</sup>. The auction will be at his driveway. For those who can't attend, sealed bids will be accepted. All auction proceeds are going directly to Toys-4-Tots!

#### **Elections at November Meeting**

Current VP, Secretary and Treasurer will run for their existing seats. Ron Keith approached Keith before the meeting to step up and run for President. During the meeting, **Keith formally nominated Ron Keith for the office of Club President**.

The meeting adjourned at 9:35 am followed by a Pilots' Briefing for the pylon races.

Meetings: Our November club meeting will be held at the field at 9:00 am, Saturday November 19<sup>th</sup>.

Agenda will include our elections for 2023 club officers, and banquet funding approval and planning (in Jan 2023).

#### **Club Officer Elections at the November meeting:**

Ron Keith approached me and mentioned that he's considering running for Club President. With his tremendous give-a-\$h\*t and dedication, I absolutely agreed that he would be a fine candidate. To help Ron with the onslaught of administrative work that goes along with it, he's supported by and backed by his better half, Mona.

At the October meeting, I formally nominated Ron for the office.

**Renewal Season:** We're approaching then end of the year and our club fiscal and membership calendar begins in January. We're now accepting your 2023 renewals!

At the turn of the new year, members paid up and in good standing will receive their 2023 membership badge and new gate code. We'll have one or two "badge days" at the field during which you can take care of business. We'll also issue badges at the Awards Banquet. Stragglers will be taken care of on a case basis after that, either by mail or in-person at the field.

Be sure that your AMA membership and FAA registration are both current.

<u>Lighted Flag!</u> – As mentioned in the minutes, Butch donated and Jeff procured a solar-powered light for the flag pole. The next day, the light was installed!! Very nicely done gentlemen!

Runway Courtesy: Consider this: you land and your model ends up down on the far west end, either dead stick or you're stuck in the weeds. Now consider your path to retrieve the model. Please avoid walking down the middle of the runway. That is unless, of course, you're the only person there or there's no one waiting to take off or land. We've seen several instances in which pilots are waiting on a member to get off the runway. Consider walking down the driveway area, and when you get close to your model, cut directly across and then go back to the driveway. This minimizes the time you're tying up the runway.

<u>Front Gate</u>: Somehow over the last couple of months our front gate was damaged, most likely due to evening "residents" backing their motor homes up against the gate. We've seen it before, people parking back into our driveway while the gate is closed. It's apparently a good place to get some overnight shut-eye. At some point, the very bottom of the pole that normally drives into the ground when securing the gate was bent so badly that it kinked and had to be broken off to get the gate shut.

I called County Parks (it's their gate, after all) to bring it to their attention and to ask if they



wanted to do anything about it. They've seen similar damage on other gates. The consensus is to just leave it alone. The gate is secure enough with the chain holding the two halves of the gate together when locked. It's not worth the effort to repair the post since it will likely be bent/broken again in the future.

#### **Building and Flying:**

Lyle Black brought out an F7F that he picked up on a web-based auction site. It's an ARF, but surely NOT for beginners. It was equipped with twin gas engines – Fuji I recall, but don't trust me.






