

## **Meeting Minutes Nov 2022**

**Call to Order**: The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am at the field. Club officers present were the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. A total of nineteen members were present.

Hangar News

The meeting was kicked off with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of minutes: Approval of the minutes of the September meeting was moved by Jerry Conklin, seconded by Bruce Allen, , approved

#### **Treasurers Report:**

A good portion of the income was the generous donation of \$1000 towards the awards banquet. Expenses and income associated with the Veteran's Day event will be tabulated and included in the next report.

We're already seeing some monthly savings with the outhouse service having been reduced to every other week.

Motion to approve – Ron Keith, seconded by Fred Miller, approved.

Safety Officer Report: When starting nitro engines in the pit area, Ron asks that the owner be attentive to the model at all times and not stray from the table. (Pres note: As a reminder, we prefer that engines be run at the starting tables, and not in the pits. However, we've avoided making that a rule thus far.) That being said, when starting models at a starting table, it's acceptable to momentarily walk the transmitter over to a flight station and then go back to retrieve the model.

On the matter of earbuds (for music or phone use), they shouldn't be worn when at the flightline and while flying models. It's important to be aware of call-outs at the flight line. It was brought up that this isn't a rule (as yet), but should be observed as a matter of safety. It was also discussed that having at least one ear un-blocked should suffice for situational awareness. This doesn't apply to hearing aids.

The Crash Bag: There've been several instances of crashes of LiPo powered models that are beyond line-of-site in the river bed or brush areas during which the crash bag wasn't taken to the scene. The crash bag contains all of the necessary tools for incipient firefighting. Ron brought up that there've been complaints that the bag is heavy. Yes, it's slightly heavier than the previous bag because the bag itself is sturdier. Ron also said that, if the model is in direct line-of-sight (you can see it) and there's no smoke, there's no real need to grab the crash bag.

#### **Previous events:**

Veteran's Day Fly-In, Saturday Nov. 12<sup>th</sup>. There was a substantial turn-out with excellent carne asada. Many thanked Ron for the outstanding job on the meats. While the actual expenses for food weren't yet available, the raffle was reported to have brough in \$615 in ticket sales, with \$782 expended – a very good margin! The Toys for Tots collection continued (from the swap meet) with cash collections totaling \$413. Lester Moore will turn the cash to toys in upcoming weeks for transfer to the Marine Corps Reserves.

#### **Upcoming Events:**

Annual Awards Banquet, 06 Jan 2023

The President presented the budget for approval.

Changes from last year:

Net change from Elks Lodge - \$15 bump in liability insurance – and that's it.



Expected drop in raffle ticket sales, loss of \$450

Intentional cut in plaques – QTY 12 to QTY 4 saves \$200.

Cost to treasury \$1,936 (saves \$185 from last year)

With the donation of \$1,000, net cost to the club is reduced to \$936. So, we can keep the <u>same</u> guest attendance price of \$25/person.

Richard Brown moved to approve the budget, seconded by Bruce Allen; approved The deposit to the Elks' club is due now. To the Treasurer for action.

#### Old Business:

<u>Storage unit roof</u> Dean Butterfield and Jeff talked plans. The material estimate was approved in prior meetings and is expected to be purchased very soon.

West-end charging system: With Kurt Meade on the mend, Bruce Allen agreed to contact Kurt to get a quick turn-over and work towards completing the connection between the solar panels and the batteries.

<u>Runway cracks</u> are still on hold.

<u>Remote ID and FRIA</u>: Keith reminded the club of the recent emails from the AMA that they're recognized by the FAA as a Community Based Organization and that FAA-recognized identification area (FRIA) applications will start soon.

**Rules Review**: Keith reviewed Rule #9 that transmitters operating on 72 MHz must not be turned ON unless the pilot has the appropriate frequency clothespin on the transmitter. Oddly and surprisingly, this rule came into play and was followed perfectly in November when two members, both having 72 MHz systems at the same time, <u>both having the same channel</u> paid heed to the pin box and coordinated to ensure that only the TX with the pin turned on! Worked out perfectly! Who would have thought that there would be a conflict in this day and age? But there you have it - disaster averted due to Rule #9!

#### New Business:

Officer Elections at November Meeting

Without opposition, the candidates will take their position by acclamation following this meeting.

Congratulations to Ron Keith as our newly elected President!

Jeff and Scott retain their seats, and Keith move into the Secretary position.

Keith will continue on the Board as Secretary. We have a club meeting at the field, 10 December, at 0900 for about a half hour.


