

Meeting Minutes 04 Mar 2023

<u>Call to Order</u>: The meeting was called to order at 9:03 am at the field. Club officers present were the President, Secretary and Treasurer. The Vice President was otherwise detained supporting our Armed Forces. A total of **twenty-six** members were present. The meeting was kicked off with the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Approval of minutes</u>: Approval of the minutes of the February meeting was moved by Steve Shepersky, seconded by Richard Brown, adopted by consensus (no vote collected).

<u>Safety Officer Report</u>: <u>Fishing Line in River Bed</u>: Following up on last month's report from the County that fishing line and hooks had been found strung amongst trees in the riverbed, Ron toured the area and didn't find any obvious signs of such sabotage. (However, continue to be vigilant.)

<u>Fire Extinguisher at the North gate</u>: Ron brought the plastic container he described last month to put a fire extinguisher adjacent to the east gate. He'll enlist manpower during the week to emplace the extinguishers.

<u>East Fence Visibility</u>: Ron also polled the club for assistance during the week to install a fresh set of pool noodles on the top of the eastern boundary fence (for visibility).

Rules Review: Rule 10 was reviewed in that pilots must remain behind the flight line fences when flying. This is to protect pilots from injury due to stray aircraft. For pilots who lean on the fence due to our old sore backs, we're reminded to grab a chair and sit down behind the fence.

<u>Fun Fly:</u> The February fun-fly was canceled due to lack of interest (only four participants).

<u>Pylon Races</u>: The February pylon races were cancelled due to rain. Glen Merritt (Race Event Coordinator) explained that, given the number of scheduled race dates (every 4th Saturday), we won't hold rain dates to make up for lost events. The next race is scheduled for Saturday March 25th.
