




Arnold Lipschutz, 12/20/1934 - 4/20/2024

April 2024 President's Message

April has been an interesting month at the field and rain seems to be prevalent on the weekends.

We had a meeting on 6 April with about 25 people which was good since we had much to discuss. If you did not make it, you missed out.

The field was closed on 10 April for a private event that consisted of 40 military personnel from Lebanon for a drone presentation. The local company conducts business around the world. Two charter buses showed up with 34 men and 6 women. Two SUVs full of equipment, ten drones, a large screen TV, generator PA system and headsets. It looked like something out of a black ops movie. Tuesday, 9 April their first drone rehearsal was conducted at 1300 for a few hours. The 10th was the all-day event. The company pilot put the drones through its commands in the air – it was quite a show. They had a catered food truck for lunch and by 1600 everyone left the field. They were well prepared and organized. If you are interested in more information, please let me know.

With 40 people at the field, I was accompanied by two of our Field Marshals, Steve Shepersky and Dick Milhausen. They stepped up and spent most of the day with me and the 40 visitors. Thanks for your assistance!

I apologize for the announcements not getting posted on the web until the 9^{th} , but I did place signs on the gate and pin box on the 8^{th} . In the future I will ensure it will not happen again.

We had a small issue with the nursery tenant. A plane crashed into the white pump house upsetting "Jake" and now the owner of the property wants \$150 for damages. The Board is working on this. The plane was returned, and I talked to the pilot. I still need to talk to the property owner. In the meantime, PLEASE do not push the east fence boundary. FLY TO THE WEST!

Projects scheduled to start:

Pit roof – patch or replace metal. When the pit roof is complete, we will rework the tables – volunteers needed. We hope to finish this project within the month. We are getting quotes on sheet metal and new wood. The sinkhole is back. Rich Brown and I plan to work on this task 29 April.

If compliance with recommendations is not met, he will be grounded for 30 days. In Rule 11, the <u>flag/plane marker</u> changed to the <u>county fence</u> at east end of runway.

Note: there will likely be a future expense for repairing some of our run tables.

Our club has received on-going recognition as a Gold Leader Club with submission of the 2024 AMA Leader Club Currency Report.

Leader Members – It is a new AMA requirement this year for on-going recognition as a Leader Club that at least one member of the club be a Leader Member. This is a program designed to recognize leaders in the modeling community. Three classifications exist: Administrative, Industry, and Scientific. Members recognized in this program help to administer Academy activities as well as maintain and vote on the AMA bylaws. Information and applications are available from the Membership Department at AMA Headquarters. Jeff C. and Keith M. applied and were approved. Jeff described the process of applying (it's like a resume) and encourages other club members to participate.

This glider is the FMX Fox owned by Steve Morton.

The pilot is Lyle Black. His "V" Diamond is sporting a .15 OS with a 7x4 pusher propeller and a 6 oz fuel tank. It is a conversion from an electric ARF, and with the battery in the nose, it required 3 oz to balance out. It flies very stable and smooth at high speeds but at low speeds is pitch stable but roll sensitive. It is not using stabilization so it is exciting to fly. It is 33" long with a 36" wingspan and 248 sq. of wing area.



George Pearsol, a fellow Weedwacker, will soon expand his business Serious Air Custom Airbrushing to a storefront in Parkway Plaza. Many of us have seen his handiwork, particularly those who've been at our T-28 races that Grave Digger flew in. He's painted several members' models.

George got the keys to his new location in mid-April and will open his doors mid-May. Some of our club members are participating in his store setup. George would like members to know that his services include painting models as well his normal menu of shirts, team jerseys, helmets, sports banners, ball caps, and tons more. Arnold Lipschutz, 12/20/1934 – 4/20/2024

Arnold passed away on the morning of April 20th, 2024 at the age of 89 He joined the Weedwackers' club in 2016 and was the most endearing and upstanding gentlemen we could have enjoyed the company of.

Arnold would often bring Subway sandwiches to field events and cleanup days, and just about every weekend brough a six-pack of bottled water to share with anyone who was thirsty.

In 2016 he started bringing planes in for show and tell nearly every month, demonstrating his love for kit-bashing and scratch-building. The first kit he brought to a club meeting was called a Decaf (cut down Decathlon). He didn't like the wings, so he modified the wings and fuselage and added a Saito 4-stroke 30. In July 2016, he brought in a kit-built Tiger Moth. In Oct 2016 he produced an Ace Bingo, yet another beautifully built kit:







In December of that same year, he showed off a new Ace 4-40 Bipe which he modified to include ailerons in the top wing.

With his first year as a club member being so productive, Arnold was recognized as 2016's Builder of the Year.

Sep - PT-17 Oct - Bingo 40 (Ace) Nov - Sig Hog Dec - 4-40 Bipe (Ace)



During 2017, Arnold continued his building spree. In February he displayed the naked bones of a Sig Hog Bipe with an OS FX 61 in front. Arnold opted to go pull-pull on the rudder and an arrow shaft on the elevator, all hidden from view. Arnold would later cover the model with SolarTech.





And here it is at the following March 2017 meeting, finished. Once month later in April of 2017, he produced a Bingo with rounded edges, thicker wings and a fuselage modified to fit a wider landing gear.



Later in June of 2017, he outfitted his Sig Hog Bipe with an on-board video camera which he asked many of the members to fly. Here's a view from his cockpit camera on June 30th, 2017.

In Feb 2020 he worked on converting some single-stick radios to 2.4 GHz.

During the COVID years, he kit-bashed a Carl Goldberg Falcon 56 and Sr. Falcon, and built up





a Lou Andrews Aeromaster too.


Arnold was our builder of the year for 2020.

In March 2021, he was back at it. From plans, he built the Mini Bell in just two weeks. Arnold converted it to a tail-dragger













In March 2022, he bashed, yet again, a Bingo 40 from, transforming it into a biplane





In 2024, a large portion of Arnold's fleet were completed with the help of Lyle Black. Arnold loved to invite many of the members to fly his planes – he so loved watching them fly, and they all few well!

His are some of most beautifully built models we've seen at the field.

Here's a tidbit of recognition to the event:

"Over several months in 2024, Lyle put on the final pre-flight touches on six of Arnold Lipschutz' hand-crafted models. Included in one grand Lipschutz air show were Arnold's Tiger Moth, PT-17, P-51, Ace 4-40 Bipe, Sig Skybolt and a Cox Pica Waco. Only the Waco had flown before – all others saw

their maiden flights today.

All flights went very well, with a minor exception that Lyle learned the Tiger Moth's flying wires were in fact meant to be functional. Lyle was able to bring it down safely while countering the effects of significantly variable dihedral!

Congratulations to Arnold for the successful exhibition of his fleet, and well done to Lyle who successfully maidened them all!

This is Arnold Lipschutz' 4-40 Bipe. Lyle Black has been preparing many of Arnold's planes for maiden or re-maiden flights.

Lyle's plan is that, when Arnold and he can get a common day together, Lyle will fly Arnolds latest fleet of four models which includes this 4-40 Bipe, a Tiger Moth, PT-17 and a P-51. Lyle's calling it "Arnold's Air Force".
